FOOD PANTRIES

There are over 500 places in LA County that distribute food bags or hot meals for free. You can find out about specific locations by calling 211 or visit www.healthycity.org to find food pantry locations by zip code.

FOOD STAMPS/CALFRESH

CalFresh (also known as Food Stamps or SNAP) is a government program that provides benefits so that you and your family will not go hungry and is administered through the Department of Public Social Services (DPSS). Call (866) 613-3777 to have an application mailed to you or apply online at www.dpssbenefits.lacounty.gov. If you want to apply in person, the closest DPSS office is at 11110 W. Pico Blvd.

CHILD NUTRITION

School Meals - *All low-income students are eligible for free or very low-cost school meals, regardless of immigration status. You should receive an application for the meal program at the beginning of the school year or whenever your child transfers.*

Summer Lunch Program - *All children age 18 or under can eat free, nutritious meals during the summer or any time when school is out through the Summer Lunch Program. Contact the LA County Info Line at 211 for more information.*

WIC

WIC (Special Supplemental Nutrition program for Women, Infants and Children) is a free nutrition program that helps pregnant women, new mothers, infants and children under 5 years of age to eat well and stay healthy.
