Provide leadership and creativity in developing and implementing progressive, humane social policy and social services that address the needs of a diverse population.

1.	Contract with non-profit organizations to provide social services so that people can remain living independently in their own homes.	
2.	Inform the community about key public health issues, particularly HIV and substance abuse prevention.	
3.	Educate the community about available local social services and County and State entitlement programs.	
4.	Maintain demographic data on the following target populations in particular, and measure social services need, service use and satisfaction levels:
