# CITY OF WEST HOLLYWOOD LESBIAN AND GAY ADVISORY BOARD MINUTES – SEPTEMBER 13, 2007 COMMUNITY CONFERENCE ROOM, CITY HALL

## I. CALL TO ORDER

#### A. ROLL CALL

The West Hollywood Lesbian and Gay Advisory Board was called to order by Co-Chair Jimmy Palmieri at 7:00 p.m., Thursday, September 13, 2007, in the Community Conference Room at 8300 Santa Monica Boulevard, West Hollywood.

Members Present: Chris Clarkin, Dan Berkowitz, Bill Gordon, Rev. Pat Langlois, Jimmy Palmieri, Elisabeth Sandberg, Sue Sexton, Nadia Sutton, and Ruth Tittle. A quorum was present. Jeff Book, staff liaison, was also present.

## II. <u>AGENDA ITEMS</u>

#### A. POSTING OF AGENDA

Staff reported that the agenda had been posted at City Hall and other locations as required.

# B. <u>APPROVAL OF AGENDA</u>

Without objection, Item 4C (Truro Flag Issue) was deleted. The rest of the agenda was approved as presented.

# C. <u>MINUTES</u>

Minutes of meetings from April 12 to date were approved, with members abstaining with regard to any meetings from which they were absent.

#### III. ITEMS FROM THE PUBLIC

Durk Dehner of the Tom of Finland Foundation invited board members to the Erotic Art Fair, which is planned for Sept. 22-23 at West Hollywood Park. It will be preceded by a reception from 8 to 11 p.m. on Friday, Sept. 21.

## A. EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

Norma Kemper, member of the Public Safety Commission, discussed the city's

emergency preparedness system, and reminded listeners to plan for disruptions expected in connection with a major earthquake, such as a need for water and food for several days.

## B. GAY MEN'S HEALTH EVENT

Hernan Molina, Deputy to Mayor John Duran, said they are considering a one-day conference in April, with a reception the evening before. A committee is planning the event. Bill Gordon said he hoped efforts would be made to draw a representative group of young people to the event, and not just those who are already considered activists, because of differences in how young people view the issues being discussed.

## IV. NEW BUSINESS

#### A. <u>CRYSTAL METHAMPHETAMINE</u>

On a motion by Chris Clarkin, seconded by Elisabeth Sandberg, the Advisory Board recommended approval of a resolution calling on the presidential candidates to address the epidemic use of crystal methamphetamine, and their planned responses to it, as part of their platforms. The item will be forwarded to the City Council, and if approved there, distributed to the candidates.

## V. RAINBOW KEY

The Advisory Board discussed options for awarding Rainbow Keys, including monthly presentations at City Council, periodic but not monthly presentations, and a single annual event like the recent luncheon. An evaluation of these options will be placed on an upcoming agenda.
