

Please join Impact Stories History Project and the City of West Hollywood's Arts and Cultural Affairs Commission in a joint public art and history project titled *Dancers We Lost* (DWL). Impact Stories and the Commission are collaborating to highlight DWL within the 30+ Art AIDS WeHo project that is a cornerstone of West Hollywood's 30th Anniversary of Cityhood celebration. Exhibitions will take place at MOCA PDC, the West Hollywood Library, ONE Gallery and Archives, at the LA Pride Festival, and along streets and in businesses throughout the City. DWL will be the most public of the exhibits, with beautiful images of dancers lost to AIDS displayed on street banners and in various public and private settings. Businesses can participate by becoming a sponsor and displaying an image of a dancer in their windows, lobbies or other location in their business. Banners will be on display from June through September. Sponsors will be listed on the DWL website and the business location hosting the banner will be on a walking tour map of the banner locations. In addition to the banner display, there will also be information on the dancer available at each location. Businesses can participate at 3 different levels depending upon the type of display desired:

\$100 - hanging photo on foam core display

\$200 - large double-sided hanging banner

\$300 - large retractable banner and stand
