

Harvey Milk Day 2015

The City of West Hollywood proudly celebrates Harvey Milk Day annually! People around the world commemorate Harvey Milk Day by giving back to their communities and helping others. Harvey Milk was the first openly gay individual to hold elected office in the United States when he served on the San Francisco Board of Supervisors from 1977 until his untimely death in 1978. Harvey Milk's legacy as a civil rights leader is still felt today. He was named one of TIME Magazine's most influential people of the 20th century. He was posthumously awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 2009 and was the subject of a movie for which Sean Penn won the Academy Award for best actor. Many Institutions and organizations are named for Harvey Milk to commemorate his life and social contributions. In October of 2009, Governor Schwarzenegger signed a bill to create a state day of recognition for Harvey Milk, to be observed on Harvey Milk's birthday, May 22. Many public schools and other educational institutions in California conduct commemorative projects, events and activities in memory of Harvey Milk on May 22. Topics such as equal rights are especially promoted on this day
