# CITY OF WEST HOLLYWOOD LESBIAN AND GAY ADVISORY BOARD MINUTES – JUNE 2, 2009 WEST HOLLYWOOD PARK AUDITORIUM

# I. CALL TO ORDER

Jeanne Cordova, Lillian Faderman, Don Kilhefner, and Mark Thompson gave extended remarks about the early days of the gay and lesbian movement.

Mike Ai, Jordan Raha, and Sara Pollaro gave remarks about current gay and lesbian activism.

There was an extended discussion of how things have changed, and how both older and younger activists may benefit from the point of view of the other.

There was extended discussion with questions and answers from the audience.
