Formosa Park Ribbon-Cutting: The City has a beautiful new pocket park on the City's eastside that will be officially opened with a ribbon-cutting this **Saturday, August 15, 2009 at 10 a.m**. The park, designed by landscape architect Katharine Spitz, while a work of art in itself, also has a public art component - "Tree Form" an open weave bronze sculpture created by artist Karl Saliter. Formosa Park is located just north of Santa Monica Boulevard - on Formosa, of course. Look for the stunning new red-colored condominiums on the east side of the street.

New NEA Chair Confirmed: Last Friday, the U.S. Senate confirmed Broadway producer Rocco Landesman to serve as the next chair of the National Endowment for the Arts. Upon his nomination, Mr. Landesman commented: "Art is essential to the civic, economic, and cultural vitality of our nation. It reflects who we are and what we stand for—freedom of expression, imagination, and vision.
