### PATH (PEOPLE ASSISTING THE HOMELESS)

PATH provides emergency/transitional housing and also has a street outreach program. Contact the Social Services Division at the City of West Hollywood at (323) 848-6510 for possible placement at one of the PATH shelter locations and/or for other housing/shelter referrals.

## LOS ANGELES HOMELESS SERVICES AUTHORITY (LAHSA) WINTER SHELTER PROGRAM

Winter shelter program operates from November 1, 2015-March 31, 2016. Listed below are the shelter options closest to West Hollywood. For a full list of shelter options throughout LA County call (800) 548-6047 or visit the website at www.lahsa.org/winter\_shelter\_program.

Ascencia – Glendale 1219 Los Angeles St. Glendale, CA 91204

Program operates as a walk-in shelter. Participants can begin to line up at 4:30pm (no early line ups). Doors will open at 5:00pm. Participants can bring only items that can fit underneath their cot.

Weingart Center Association 566 S. San Pedro St. Los Angeles, CA 90013 (213) 833-5020

33 bed program which operates as a <u>walk-in</u> shelter. Participants may arrive between 8am-2pm to get signed up for the shelter for that evening.

First to Serve, Inc. - West LA Armory 1300 Federal Ave. Los Angeles, CA 90025 (323) 758-4670

150 bed program. No walk-ups will be allowed and guests will be allowed to bring one bag to the shelter. Transportation pick-up points are at the Venice Beach Boardwalk (near skate park-Market Street @ Ocean Front Walk) at 5:00, 6:30, and 7:15pm. The armory will be closed on 1/8, 1/9, 2/3, 2/6 and 3/30.

To get to the Venice pick up site on bus (complete trip is approximately 1 ½ hours):

- Metro Rapid 705 South at Santa Monica/San Vicente (SW corner) and exit at Venice/Cadillac (7 stops)
- Metro 33 West towards Venice and exit at Main/Grand.
- Walk west on Main St. for about one block. Once you reach Market St. walk south toward the ocean, until you reach Ocean Front Walk.

### L.A. FAMILY HOUSING

LA Family Housing serves homeless and low-income families with children and singles adults with shelter/housing at locations in North Hollywood and East Los Angeles as noted below. Call (818) 982-4091 or visit www.lafh.org for more information.

- Sydney M. Irmas Transitional Living Center in North Hollywood provides 260 beds
  of emergency and transitional housing with supportive services for homeless children
  and their families.
- Comunidad Cesar Chavez is the major provider of emergency shelter and supportive services for homeless families in East Los Angeles with 140 beds for children and their parents.
- Trudy & Norman Louis Valley Shelter in North Hollywood provides emergency and transitional housing and supportive services for more than 1,000 homeless single adults annually.

#### **DROP/IN EMERGENCY SHELTER FOR YOUTH**

- Emergency Overnight Bed 30 day program, ages 18-24. Daily check-in for available bed.
- Enhanced Emergency Shelter Program- 36 day, ages 18-25. Required to work with the Department of Mental Health. Daily check-in for available bed.

Shelter accomodations for youth (18-25) on a first come, first serve basis with services including dinner, showers, laundry, case management. Some clothing available as well. Shelter pickup locations at 628 San Julian St. (3:00pm), Corner of Gage & Broadway (3:30pm), 108<sup>th</sup> Central Ave. (4:00pm) & Corner of 88<sup>th</sup> & Broadway (4:30pm). Walk ins from 5:00-8:00pm pending availability.
