We've selected one Project of the Year Award and 20 specific project awards from a pool of 74 eligible projects.

The 2016 Region 9 Awards will be presented during the Awards Dinner on March 31, 2017 in Los Angeles at the Samuel Oschin Pavilion, California Science Center. The guest list includes representatives from the National Society and members from throughout the State.

The Public Relations Society of America, Los Angeles Chapter held their 52nd Annual PRISM Awards Show on Wednesday, November 16, 2016 at the Taglyan Complex in Hollywood. More than 400 people attended the awards event, which represents distinguished communications efforts by public relations agencies, corporations, nonprofits, and government organizations in the greater Los Angeles area.

The Automated Parking Garage Launch Event was held on Tuesday, May 24, 2016 to unveil the City's new 200-space fully automated structure at West Hollywood City Hall. The grand opening event and ribbon cutting ceremony was as futuristic as the project — it utilized high-resolution video renderings of the structure's engineering components displayed on a jumbo-scale LED display, and offered small group tours of public-art murals and vehicle bays. There were heavy

appetizers from local restaurants, which benefit from additional parking offered by the Automated Parking Garage, and there was electronic music in a live DJ set by local beat master Derek Monteiro. Every major local television station covered the event with extremely positive reporting about the West Coast's first municipal automated parking structure.

What the judges said:
