1. Proposed Title IX Changes regarding sexual assault. The Department of Education's new Title IX rules will guarantee that anybody

accused of sexual assault on any campus receiving federal funds will have the right to cross examine the accuser.

- 2. Proposed Title IX Changes to the definition of gender The Health and Human Services proposed definition would define sex as either male or female, unchangeable, and determined by the genitals that a person is born with.
- 3. Reauthorization of the Violence Against Women Act, VAWA VAWA set asides funding for investigations into violent crimes associated with domestic and sexual violence designed to end violence against women. VAWA also financed legal aid, funded shelters for victims, provided federal grants for advocacy groups helping domestic violence survivors and toughened federal charges
- **4.** House Congressional Resolution 72 A joint Congressional Resolution affirming child safety as the first priority of custody and visitation adjudications and that State courts should improve adjudications of custody where family violence is alleged.
