5.D. "WEHO GIVES BACK" CAMPAIGN [L. MEISTER, J. HEILMAN, J. LEONARD, A. LOVANO]:

SUBJECT: The City Council will consider allocating a portion of the parking meter revenues for the week of December 26, 2019 through December 31, 2019 to fund additional supplies for people experiencing homelessness in West Hollywood.

RECOMMENDATIONS: 1) Direct the Strategic Initiatives Division to work with the Parking Services Division to ensure that ten percent of the parking meter revenue collected during the week of December 26-31, 2019 is used to fund supplies for people experiencing homelessness in West Hollywood; and 2) Authorize the Director of Finance & Technology Services to allocate ten percent of parking meter revenue collected during the week of December 26 31, 2019 in fiscal year 2019-20 to account number 100-3-05-54-531019 to fund the supplies.
