The resolution should also include the following conditions suggested by staff, 1) The antenna placed on the property shall be limited in wattage by sector to: A Sector - 100 degrees true: 10 B Sector - 270 degrees true: 10 watts ERP; watts ERP; C Sector - 340 degrees true: 30 watts ERP; 2) Any claim of interference with the operations of any business or residential use due to the operation of the facility shall be subject to correction by the permittee. claim shall be reviewed by a qualified, mutually agreeable third party who will test actual site conditions and propose mitigatons of any interference determined to be due to the operation of the facility; and 3) the facility shall have clearly posted the name, address and telephone number of responsible parties who may be contacted regarding problems of operations and claims of interference.
