Silvia Salguero is a bilingual licensed clinical social worker who provides mental health services. She currently works at a private practice in downtown Los Angeles. Silvia has worked in community mental health clinics, schools, and private practice settings. Silvia has had the privilege of working with a variety of different populations such as foster

children, immigrant families, high-risk youth, and women. Silvia has taken a special interest in working with women and young girls. Silvia believes in the power of giving back and providing support for others.

Silvia began volunteering in high school and attended events in the West Hollywood area. Silvia was a recipient of the West Hollywood Youth Scholarship Awards in 2009. a program that was funded for several years by contributions from the West Hollywood Women in Leadership Awards. She became interested in learning more about the city she was raised in and began volunteering for Mayor Lindsey Horvath's office before attending college. During her time in college, Silvia participated in conferences such as the West Hollywood Women's Leadership Conference where she helped develop the "Young Women in Power" leadership program. After graduating college, Silvia was appointed to the Women's Advisory Board in 2013, served as Chair for a term and continued her service until 2019. During her tenure on the Board, she was notably an advocate for youth and mental health awareness and services. Silvia also served on the Board of Directors for Friends of the West Hollywood Library from 2016-2017.

She graduated from the University of Southern California in 2015 with a Master's in Social Work with a concentration in mental health and from the University of California, Riverside with a Bachelor's in Psychology in 2013.



Katie Brightside

Welcome to the Brightside [™] Creative Director, Recipient of the Phyllis Morris Award named in honor of the design pioneer, with almost 20 years of experience as an artist and designer, Katie created the Welcome to the Brightside Agency. The company works with a melting pot of creative's in all spectrums of the arts to deliver unique projects, wallpaper,

murals, books, illustrations, and installations. Imagination and production show no limits. Clients include Kimpton La Peer Hotel, The West Hollywood Design District, The City of West Hollywood, Disney, Sesame Street, The Magic Castle, Yamashiro, The Farmer Daughter Hotel, and many more.

Recently with an invitation to design two mural artworks for Pasadena Showcase House, April 26, 2020, Katie devised a new company, *The Digs Collection*. Digs is short for diggings, both words slang for home. It will be Katie's first range commercially available to the public, with mural-size wall art with matching kimono's. However, it's not your typical homeware company. The company has appropriated the original motto and uses 'home is where your toothbrush is' which brings to mind 'home' is ever-changing. A bit like the quest to understanding who we are and our purpose on the planet. We're curious energy that shifts and changes. The digs collection, therefore, reflects this metamorphic concept as a tangible artwork in your home, in your personal sanctuary, for you to wake each day a new butterfly and to begin another day of transformation. The philosophy is to evoke the home with aspiration, either of who you are or who you want to become.

Graduating with a BA in fashion at Kingston University, UK, 2001, Katie moved to Treviso, Italy, where she worked as a designer at the United Colours of Benetton. In 2002 she relocated to Sydney, Australia. In 2012 the aMBUSH Gallery hosted her first of many solo exhibitions where 1000 people attended opening night. This successful exhibition inspired a thirst for further education, MA Fine Art, Central Saint Martin (CSM), London. After graduation Katie sort advice from a White Witch to where she would live happily-ever-after. A week later Katie fulfilled that prophecy by moving to West Hollywood.



Emiliana Guereca

Emiliana Guereca is an activist, feminist, entrepreneur and President of Women's March Foundation, which she founded in 2016. She is the driving force behind 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020 official Women's Marches in Los Angeles. Emiliana devotes much of her time to advocacy programs for women's rights, Latino education, and gender equality and has

served as a bridge between community organizations and coalition building that spans national levels. Emiliana's most recent endeavor includes launching Women's March Action, the 501(c)4 political arm of Women's March Foundation. Personally, Emiliana is proud to serve her Latin community and has also built roots in the Jewish community, as she raises her family in the Jewish faith. Emiliana has been awarded the National Women's Political Caucus: Women of Courage Award 2019, the State of California: Pioneer Women of 2017 Award, the HOPE: Latina of the Year Award 2017, LA County: Pioneer Women of 2018 and the Pat Brown Institute: Civic Engagement Award 2018. Emilana also served as a surrogate for Vice President Kamala Harris.

Emiliana is currently working on funding a Women's Building in the heart of Los Angeles as a women-led community space that advocates self-determination, gender equality and social justice.



Fran Solomon

Fran Solomon served as Council Deputy from 1993-2015 to The Honorable John Heilman, the longest serving Councilmember/Mayor in the city's history. Her staunch advocacy of human rights and social justice issues led to over two decades of legislative advocacy and the development and implementation of programming to support a long list

of City initiatives including The Women's Leadership Conference, The West Hollywood Human Rights Speaker Series, The West Hollywood Anti-Hunger Initiative, the annual Yom Hashoa Commemoration, the diverse and award winning West Hollywood Book Fair and The West Hollywood Library. Throughout her tenure with the City, she helped raise several million dollars in support of these and other community programs, including The Russian Cultural Festival, The Sunset Strip Music Festival and the annual Avenues of Art and Design Structure and Style Tour, benefiting The West Hollywood Community Housing Corporation.

As a West Hollywood businesswoman prior to her tenure with the City, Fran was an active member of the West Hollywood Chamber of Commerce. She organized the first Russian Business Association forum between the Russian speaking business community and West Hollywood City Councilmembers.

The forum eventually led to the formation of the City's Russian Advisory Board. Former Councilmember Abbe Land appointed her as a charter member to the City's newly formed Women's Advisory Board in 1991. She subsequently served for nearly a decade as senior staff liaison to The Women's Advisory, Lesbian and Gay Advisory, Senior Advisory, Russian Advisory and Arts and Cultural Affairs Advisory Boards. She consistently served as a mentor to City Hall interns and volunteers. Over 50 interns, including international students, served in or through her office, many of whom have come public service professionals, leaders of progressive non-profit organizations and educators. She established valuable collaborations between the City, non profit groups, community schools, the business community, residents and local, state and national elected officials to further the progressive core values of West Hollywood. In 2000, City Hall staff voted her Employee of the Year. Fran is a past Executive Board member of West Hollywood Congregation Kol Ami and was honored with their Guardian of Justice Award in 2008. Upon retirement in 2015, the California State Assembly issued a formal commendation for her many years of dedicated service and civic leadership to West Hollywood.

Fran is a 43-year active community resident of Venice Beach, California and served on the 1st Venice Town Council.

Dana is currently the host of Out in Left Field and Co-Host of the Daily Beans Podcast. As the youngest child in a single parent household run by a Jewish mother in which two of three kids are gay, Goldberg helps keep most of the comedy venues and half of the psychotherapists in the country in business"
