West Hollywood Poet Laureate Brian Sonia Wallace provided an update on the Pride Poets Program happening throughout the month of June.

West Hollywood Chamber of Commerce President/CEO Genevieve Morrill gave a presentation on WeHo Pride 2021.

## 1. PUBLIC COMMENT:

ADAM DARVISH, WEST HOLLYWOOD, spoke in support of Items 2.M. and 2.P.

GENEVIEVE MORRILL, WEST HOLLYWOOD, spoke in support of Item 2.O.

VAL CARLSON, END HOMELESSNESS NOW LA, spoke about homelessness issues and in support of Item 2.R.

JORDAN DAVID, WEST HOLLYWOOD, spoke in support of Item 2.R. and allocating more funding for social services.

NICK RIMEDIO, WEST HOLLYWOOD, spoke regarding the proposed hotel worker ordinance and the effects of the proposal on the hospitality/business community.

BILL KARPIAK, WEST HOLLYWOOD TRAVEL & TOURISM BUREAU, spoke regarding the proposed hotel worker ordinance and its impact on hotels.

KERRI BALBONE, WEST HOLLYWOOD, spoke regarding initiating in-person community events safely such as National Night Out.

LINDSEY DEATON, WEST HOLLYWOOD, spoke regarding arts and cultural opportunities in the City and mentioned the new Meringue art in the median of Santa Monica Boulevard.

ENOCH MILLER, WEST HOLLYWOOD, spoke in support of Item 2.R.

## COUNCILMEMBER COMMENTS AND MEETING ATTENDANCE REPORTS:

Councilmember D'Amico thanked his colleagues for their Consent Calendar items, particularly Items 2.P., 2.Q., and 2.R. He noted that he will not be at the June 21<sup>st</sup> City Council meeting and requested that the hotel worker ordinance item be moved to July 19<sup>th</sup> so that he can participate in the discussion of the item.

Councilmember Erickson indicated his support for Councilmember D'Amico's request to move the hotel worker ordinance item. He reported that he attended the League of California Cities Transportation, Communications, and Public Works Committee meeting. He further reported that he attended the LA County City Selection Committee and the CalCities lobby meeting with Assemblymember Bloom. He spoke about an accident on Fountain Ave. at Gardner over the weekend and would like to address safety concerns on Fountain Ave. He requested that staff return in July or August with an item proposing additional traffic safety measures for Fountain Ave. He commented on Item 2.R. and stated that if the County will not conduct the audit that he would like West Hollywood to conduct its own audit. He requested that the City Manager provide an update on the WeHo Pickup and Sunset Trolley returning to service. He also asked that the City Manager provide an update on when the Werle Building and Log Cabin will re-open so recovery meetings can be held. Finally, he suggested a discussion about inperson events.

Councilmember Shyne wished the community a Happy Pride month. She reported that she participated in the Pride Subcommittee meeting, the "Play Ball" event at WeHo Park, as well as the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of The Abbey/Born This Way unveiling on Robertson. She also reported that she attended the Homelessness Subcommittee meeting and the groundbreaking for the AIDS Monument this past Sunday. She thanked Mayor Horvath for co-sponsoring Item 2.R. with her. She also thanked Mayor Pro Tempore Meister for co-sponsoring Item 5.E. with her. She mentioned the public comment regarding dog waste and asked for an update on additional dog waste bins from staff. Finally, she mentioned the Well-Being in the Era of Covid panel discussion that will take place on June 23<sup>rd</sup>.

Mayor Pro Tempore Meister wished her mother a happy birthday. She reported that she attended the Westside Urban Forum panel, the Russian-speaking Community awards, the Southern California Association of Government's CEHD committee, the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the CDC recognition of AIDS as well as the groundbreaking for the AIDS monument. She also reported that she attended the Homelessness Subcommittee meeting. For Item 2.G., she requested a list of City events so the City Council can discuss it further at the June 21<sup>st</sup> City Council meeting. She thanked Councilmember Erickson for co-sponsoring Item 2.P. with her. She also thanked Councilmember Shyne for co-sponsoring Item 5.E. Lastly, she commented on Item 5.F. and congratulated David Wilson on his appointment as City Manager.

Mayor Horvath asked for clarification on Councilmember D'Amico's request regarding moving the discussion of the hotel worker ordinance to the July 19<sup>th</sup> City Council meeting. Assistant City David Wilson suggested a special study session sometime

earlier in July to discuss the hotel worker ordinance item. Mayor Horvath polled her fellow Councilmembers. The City Council agreed that the hotel worker ordinance item won't be heard at the June 21<sup>st</sup> meeting.

Mayor Horvath reported that she attended the Clean Power Alliance meeting, Executive meeting, Legislative Meeting, Regulatory meeting, and regular board meeting. further reported that she attended the Contract Cities Seminar and Executive Board meeting, the National League of Cities meeting, and the "Play Ball" event. She spoke about the first meeting of the Social Justice Task Force. She further reported on her attendance at the SCAG Transportation Meeting and a press conference at the IAJF She echoed Councilmember Erickson's regarding anti-Semitism in the region. comments regarding safety on Fountain Ave. She expressed concern with Sheriff's Department response times, as well as 911 dispatchers not knowing caller locations. She noted that there is a request from businesses for an increase in safety ambassadors to patrol alleyways. She shared that the City was a recipient of a FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Program to assist pre-qualified property owners for seismic retrofit improvements. She spoke about the 40th Anniversary of the CDC report on AIDS. She also mentioned an inaccuracy on the hiv.gov webpage which incorrectly states the race of the first cases of AIDS. She commented that she would like to write a letter so that the information can accurately reflect that the first cases were four (4) Caucasian males and one (1) black male. She inquired if her fellow Councilmembers would like to sign the letter and the Councilmembers agreed. Finally, she reported that 69% of the West Hollywood community has received the COVID vaccine.

#### **CITY MANAGER'S REPORT:**

Assistant City Manager David Wilson responded to Councilmember Erickson's request for an item regarding additional traffic safety measures on Fountain Ave. and noted that staff will bring an item in August. He commented that staff is in discussions with the West Hollywood Recovery Center regarding the Werle building and the Log Cabin. He further commented that those facilities will open on June 15<sup>th</sup>. He reported that Facilities staff will contact Mr. Darvish and address the dog waste issue. He shared that the Sheriff's Department will provide information on response times. He spoke about the City's budget which will be on the June 21<sup>st</sup> City Council meeting for discussion and encouraged everyone to review it on the City's website at <a href="https://www.weho.org/city-government/city-departments/finance-and-technology-services/financial-reports-budgets/city-budget">https://www.weho.org/city-government/city-departments/finance-and-technology-services/financial-reports-budgets/city-budget</a>. He mentioned One City One Pride and shared that the full list of events is listed on <a href="mailto:pride.weho.org">pride.weho.org</a>. Finally, he thanked the City Council for moving Item 5.F. to the Consent Calendar.

City Attorney Langer read the terms of the contract between the City and David Wilson for his appointment as City Manager into the record. Effective July 7, 2021, Mr. Wilson will be City Manager for the City of West Hollywood.

SUBJECT: The City Council will consider directing staff to initiate a Zone Text Amendment to define various housing types, specifically congregate care facilities, co-living, and micro-units, and develop appropriate design standards.

**ACTION**: 1) Direct staff to initiate a Zone Text Amendment to clarify and define various housing types in the Municipal Code – specifically congregate care facilities, co-living, and micro-units – and develop appropriate design standards for these housing types and others as needed; 2) Present the proposed amendment to the Planning Commission for review prior to returning to City Council for final approval; and 3) Direct staff to lobby the state to amend the definition of a "dwelling unit" under the Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA) to account for different housing types, including co-living units and congregate care facilities. **Approved as part of the Consent Calendar.**
