

RESOLUTION NO. 22-5492

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF WEST HOLLYWOOD RATIFYING
MEASURES TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF
COVID-19 AND RESCINDING SPECIFIED
EMERGENCY EXECUTIVE ORDERS AND
RESOLUTIONS RELATED TO THE COVID-19
PANDEMIC

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WEST
HOLLYWOOD DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1.

- A. For the reasons set forth in the Order, the City Manager/Director of Emergency Services Executive Order No. 2022-001 dated March 4, 2022, continuing to require all persons to wear face coverings while visiting indoor City Facilities, is hereby ratified.
- B. For the reasons set forth in the City's staff report dated March 21, 2022 recommending the City Council review existing emergency executive orders, resolutions, and ordinances related to the COVID-19 pandemic and discuss necessary modifications or rescissions thereto, the following resolutions and orders are rescinded:
 - a. Resolution No. 20-5266, Resolution of the City Council of the City of West Hollywood declaring specified construction activity an essential City function.
 - b. Resolution No. 20-5267, Resolution of the West Hollywood City Council ratifying Emergency Executive Order 2020-1 and additional City Council orders to assist local businesses through the COVID-19 crisis. The following measures specific to Resolution No. 20-5267 are hereby rescinded, and measures A, B as amended below, H and N remain in effect and full force:
 - B. (Remains in effect as amended to read as follows)
Restaurants and retail stores that have a valid City license for on-site alcohol sales and a valid ABC license may follow state law and ABC requirements, including:


1. Licensees with on-sale privileges may sell alcohol for off-site consumption in manufacturer pre-packaged containers as to which their license permits on-sale consumption.
 2. In addition to selling manufacturer pre-packaged containers as provided above, bona eating places (i.e. restaurants) selling beer, wine and pre-mixed drinks or cocktails for consumption may sell those products off the licensed premises when sold in conjunction with meals prepared for pick-up (to-go).
 3. The Department (ABC) has suspended enforcement of any license condition restricting the hours of sales and services for licensees exercising off-sale privileges, consistent with the Notice of Relief. Accordingly, all sales may run from 6:00 am to 2:00 pm.
- C. Any code or permit requirement requiring the closure of restaurants, grocery stores or other essential food-related businesses prior to 2:00 a.m. are suspended. These establishments may operate between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 2:00 a.m. (Rescinded)
- D. Parking and traffic operations plans for restaurants are suspended to allow easier access for customers picking up to-go meals. (Rescinded)
- E. Zoning regulations limiting temporary banners and A-Frame signs are suspended to allow businesses the opportunity to notify the public of additional food sales and availability of other essential goods. (Rescinded provided that the city will notify and work with the businesses to get into compliance by the end of calendar year 2022).
- F. Zoning regulations concerning the conversion of restaurant and other commercial uses to a grocery store/market use are suspended to allow commercial establishments to temporarily sell food and other essential goods. (Rescinded)

- G. Cannabis dispensaries with a city medical license may remain open in compliance with the County's Safer at Home Order, and may provide curbside sales and delivery, upon submittal of an operations plan to the City demonstrating continued compliance with applicable state and local laws and the County's Safer at Home Order. (Rescinded)
- O. The Cannabis Café may obtain a temporary medical license for the period of the local emergency. (Rescinded)
- c. Executive Order No. 2020-1, implementing emergency measures to assist local businesses through the COVID-19 crisis.
- d. Resolution No. 20-5273, Resolution of the City Council of the City of West Hollywood ratifying Emergency Executive Order 2020-2 to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
- e. Executive Order No. 2020-2, implementing emergency measures in City parks, construction sites and businesses to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
- f. Resolution No. 20-5288, Resolution of the City Council of the City of West Hollywood ratifying Emergency Executive Order 2020-3 to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
- g. Executive Order No. 2020-3, implementing emergency measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
- h. Resolution No. 20-5233, Resolution of the City Council of the City of West Hollywood ratifying Emergency Executive Order 2020-12 to prevent the spread of COVID-19 related to reopening of City Parks.
- i. Executive Order No. 2020-12, implementing emergency measures to order the reopening of City Parks adopted to prevent the further spread of COVID-19.
- j. Resolution No. 21-5444, Resolution of the West Hollywood City Council ratifying Emergency Executive Order 2021-7 to prevent the spread of COVID-19 by implementing COVID-19 vaccine verification requirements.

- k. Emergency Executive Order 2021-7 to prevent the spread of COVID-19 by implementing COVID-19 vaccine verification requirements.


