
# Introduction



### Results - Land Use

Presented visions for 5 commercial sub-areas



#### Results - Land Use

- Many comments agreed with overall vision; a few disagreed
- Many detailed comments and suggestions such as:
  - Create centralized parking solutions
  - Transform MTA site
  - Differing views about new residential on busy streets
  - Differing views on height of Melrose and Robertson and along Santa Monica Boulevard
  - Desire for more public spaces
  - Need to balance development and traffic



# Results – Transportation

- Board 1 focused on parking and subsidized transit. Results:
  - Auto parking requirements\*
  - Subsidized transit
  - Auto parking cash out
- Board 2 focused on other transportation improvements
  - Mass transit improvements
  - Pedestrian improvements
  - Bike sharing
  - More bike facilities



# Results - Sustainability

- Asked community to prioritize goals and priorities (separately)
- Goal priorities
  - Reduce building energy use
  - Reduce water use
- Policy priorities
  - Tree canopy
  - Transform alleys into green spaces
  - Close streets on weekends to cars
  - Rainwater capture
  - Require photovoltaic on new buildings



#### Results – Arts & Culture

- Strong support for arts and culture
- Highest priority policies
  - Hold community festivals and events
  - Support artists, cultural groups and institutions
  - Establish and support cultural facilities
  - Arts and cultural programming at library



#### Results - Goal Prioritization

- •45+ goals
- Taken from policy frameworks reviewed by GPAC
- Asked each person to vote for 5 goals
- Overall priorities
  - Improve and enhance parks
  - Affordable rental housing
  - Pedestrian enhancements
  - Social services
  - Preserve residential neighborhoods
  - Protect neighborhoods from cut-through traffic



# Take Away Messages

- Strong support for the overall direction of the General Plan
- Community priorities focused on several key areas:
  - Green the City
  - Support the City's unique areas arts and design, entertainment and strong neighborhoods
  - Make it safer for pedestrians
  - Continue social service programs
  - Keep existing and create new affordable housing




