County Rehabilitation Program Participation: ACTION: That the City of West Hollywood participate in the Rental Rehabilitation Program, enter into a memorandum of understanding with the Los Angeles County Housing Authority and authorize the City Manager to sign a letter of intent to operate the program with the Los Angeles County Community Development Commission

Environmental Platform Regarding Toxics: ACTION: To adopt Resolution No. 275, "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WEST HOLLYWOOD ESTABLISHING AN ENVIRONMENTAL PLATFORM REGARDING TOXICS", and by doing so, each member of the Council makes a commitment to support a new environmental platform for the city.

- r. Street and Sidewalk Cleaning Commercial Areas:
  ACTION: Staff to prepare recommendations and options for a
  comprehensive clean-up program, including fiscal impact, which
  should entail the following steps or components:
- 1.) Contact other cities to determine what they do in this area.
- 2.) Designate the worst streets and sidewalks as key target areas.
- 3.) Present recommendations and options for clean-up that require the services of both the City and the private sector.
- 4.) Develop a draft ordinance for clean streets and sidewalks in order to bring private property owners under compliance

These recommendations and options are to be back before the Council by the first or second week in February.

#### **PUBLIC HEARINGS:**

3. PERMIT PARKING DISTRICT NO. 1 EXPANSION: Continued open from the meeting of December 8, 1986: Ann Palatino gave staff report.

The following people came forward to address the Council on this item:

Steve Bradey, 147 N. La Peer; would like the existing red zones areas investigated - specifically the east side of La Peer north of Beverly Bl. and yellow zone at 149 N. La Peer.

Kathy Monahan, 8936 Beverly Blvd., PACE COLLECTION; suggested that this go back to the commission for further study.

Ron Shipton, 8718 Rosewood; wanted to know why petition process was not done and agreed that further study was in order.

Mayor Schulte closed the Public Hearing.

The area for consideration consists of 15 lots which are between the existing Permit Parking District 1 and the City of Los Angeles permit parking district which went into effect on October 24, 1986. The affected streets are Almont, La Peer, Swall, Clark and Wetherly Drives, south of Beverly Boulevard. ACTION: That the City Council include the above area in the existing permit parking District No. 1, with no parking except with residential permit on the unmetered portions of both sides of the above-named Drives, 24 hours a day, with additional residential parking available at the metered spaces off of Beverly Blvd. between 7:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. Monday through Saturday and all day Sunday. Motion Heilman second Viterbi.

Councilmember Land also requested that when the notice is sent out to the businesses, it also include the information on lighting, rear parking and shared parking.

4. APPEAL OF PLANNING COMMISSION DECISION RE. ZONE CHANGE 86-02 (PARKING OVERLAY): Dean Sherer reported that the Planning Commission denied Zone Change 86-02, a City-initiated petition, to add PK (parking overlay) zoning to properties located at 722-730 Willey Lane, 715-729 Ramage Street, and 9008-9018 Keith Avenue. This decision has been appealed within the 10-day time limit, and the appropriate fees have been paid. There has been considerable neighborhood opposition to the parking overlay on these lots and residents expressed concern over commercial encroachment into a residential area and the inadequacy of streets and alleys in the area to handle the traffic. In recommending the zone change, staff wanted to correct an inconsistency in the Zoning Map and bring the zoning into conformance with the Community Plan.

At this point Arlen Andelson spoke for the appellant and presented the City Clerk with the following documents in favor of the parking overlay and/or mixed use, or against restricted parking:

CALIFORNIA CONTRACT CITIES ASSOCIATION - VOTING DELEGATE AND ALTERNATE: ACTION: To designate Mayor Schulte the voting delegate and the remaining members of the Council as alternates to the California Contract Cities Association, and direct the City Clerk to inform CCCA. By consensus of the City Council.

STREET BEAUTIFICATION PROJECT PHASE II - DESIGN AND FINANCING OPTIONS: Staff, as instructed by the City Council, has developed several design and financing options for the street beautification project. These are: decorative intersection and crosswalks for the La Brea, Fairfax and secondary intersections in the area, with Santa Monica Blvd.; pedestrian lighting; public signage; sculptural elements; additional public amenities; and installing kiosks landscaping; for posting public information. Financing options include establishing a public improvement assessment district; tax increment financing; issuing a general obligation bond; CDBG or general fund monies and private donations and dedication of improvements. After discussion with staff. Councilmembers each noted the portions of the project that they approved of and liked. ACTION: To direct staff to return with more options for design in the \$180,000 range. By consensus of the Council.

This Ordinance provides that the west side will be permit parking only and the east side, along a vacant property, will allow general 2-hour parking from 7:00 a.m to

7:00 p.m. daily except Sundays. ACTION: To waive further reading and Introduce Ordinance No. 131, "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WEST HOLLYWOOD AMENDING THE PREFERENTIAL PARKING PROVISIONS OF THE TRAFFIC CODE RELATING TO PREFERENTIAL PARKING DISTRICT NO. 1 AND AMENDING THE WEST HOLLYWOOD MUNICIPAL CODE". Motion Heilman second Land.

10. ORDINANCE NO. 133U - RENT CONTROL: Richard Dorsey Muller reported that this Ordinance establishes procedures for changes in the use of residential rental property. Property owners will need to apply to the Department of Rent Stabilization for a change of use permit and hearings will be scheduled with the Rent Stabilization Commission. The three broad standards the Commission will use to help guide them in this decision making process are 1) vacancy factor, 2) habitability and 3) rate of return.
