988 serves as a nationwide entry point for crisis counseling across the United States, with the Los Angeles Center run by Didi Hirsch Mental Health Services. Specialized experts provide assistance to Spanish speakers and LGBTQI+ youth.

Part of LA County's Alternative Crisis Response, the Care Team provides compassionate 24/7 in-person crisis assistance when needed. The City is promoting community connection to the 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline – **988 is the number to get help.**

Here to help

The Care Team's mission is to **help people through their crisis with safety planning, resource connection, and follow-up support.** The Care Team is guided by values of harm reduction, trauma-informed care, and cultural competency.



In-Person Support when it's Needed

When a 988 caller needs in-person help, trained mobile crisis response staff are available to support the community member through the **City's collaborative partnership between LA County Department of Mental Health and the Care Team.**



Confidential and Responsive

Delivering services on-the-go, the **Care Team prioritizes confidentiality** while delivering essential services to people in their time of need. Care Team Peer Support Specialists, with first-hand insight into the experiences of people in crisis, support community members to get help without fear of judgment or stigma.



Operational Hours

The Care Team delivers around-the-clock services, **24/7, 365 days a year**—including holidays—ensuring continuous support every day of the week. In collaboration with the LA County Department of Mental Health, our program works closely with mobile teams that provide 24/7 crisis response and support.

The West Hollywood Care Team provides compassionate in-person crisis assistance. It is one component of LA County's Alternative Crisis Response alongside the 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline and Field Intervention Teams.
