City of West Hollywood Demographic Profile

West Hollywood is a City of 35,716 people, most of whom live alone or with one other adult in apartments or condominiums. Seventeen percent of the population is 65 years of age or older and 6% of the population is under 18 years of age. In addition to Seniors, other significant population groups are Gay men and immigrants from countries of the former Soviet Union. There is a wide range of income levels in the City; 22% of the population earns \$75,000 and over per year, while 20% earns less than \$14,999 annually. The residents of West Hollywood are highly educated and 84% are US citizens. The City differs from the larger Los Angeles County demographics in significant ways: it is much more densely populated; many more people are renters; there is a much larger Senior population and much smaller child and youth population; there are fewer Latino/a residents; and household size is smaller.

Some of the demographic characteristics of West Hollywood are not represented in the Census data, but have been collected through community surveys and other planning efforts. The demographic profiles in this report draw information from seven sources: the 2000 Census, the 2000 Customer Satisfaction Survey, the 1998 Community Needs Assessment Survey, the 1994 Community Needs Assessment Survey, the 1990 Census, the 2000 Housing Element, and Vision 2020 (the City of West Hollywood Strategic Plan). The percentages presented may vary somewhat, depending on the source of the data and whether the data was collected by individual or household.

In addition to the community-wide data, profiles of eight demographic groups are included in this report:

- 1) Households affected by AIDS/HIV, (people living with AIDS account for 3% of the City population and people living with HIV account for between 8% and 11%),
- 2) Households with Children, (6% of the City population is under 18 years of age and 6% of City households include children),
- 3) People with Disabilities, (24% of the City population),
- 4) Gay or Bisexual Men, (41% of the City population),
- 5) Immigrants from the former Soviet Union, (8% of the City population),
- 6) Latinos/Latinas, (9% of the City population),
- 7) Seniors, (17% of the City population) and,
- 8) Women over 18 years of age (42% of the City population).




In 2000, the population of West Hollywood was 35,716 and included 23,120 households.













Transgender estimate from 1998 Survey














































City of West Hollywood Strategic Goals Vision 2020

In 1990, the West Hollywood City Council directed staff to develop its first strategic plan, Vision 2000, which resulted in defining the projects, programs and services the City has been delivering since. In the fall of 2001, Council again asked the City Manager and staff to develop a new strategic plan. Through numerous meetings with all elements of the community, a new Mission Statement and Core Values have been developed, and five Primary Goals, based on what have emerged as the most important issues facing the city at this time. An additional list of Ongoing Strategic Programs -- programs that the City has already established as having great enough importance to be part of its work plans -- have also been specified through the process.
























How have the social service needs of your household changed as a result of combination medical therapy treatment?










Profile of Households with Children

West Hollywood Households with Children






Poverty thresholds are based on nationwide statistics and do not vary based on geographic region. Poverty thresholds are based on the number of adults and children in the household. In the 2000 Census, the threshold for a single parent with one child was \$11,483 and the threshold for two parents with two children was \$16,895. In the 1990 Census, the threshold for a single parent with one child was \$8,547 and the threshold for two parents with two children was \$12,575.


Households with Related Children Under 18 with Incomes Below the Poverty Threshold












Profile of Gay or Bisexual Men













West Hollywood Gay or Bisexual Men











Profile of Immigrants from the former Soviet Union
