City Attorney Jenkins stated that the closed session convened at 6:00 P.M. One item of initiated litigation was added to the agenda. No reportable action was taken.

Councilmember Martin requested that Item 3.C. be moved to the Consent Calendar.

Councilmember Prang requested the meeting be adjourn in memory of Teresa Mc Phee.

ACTION: Approve the November 19, 2001 Agenda as amended. Moved by Councilmember Martin, seconded by Councilmember Duran to approve the agenda as amended. Unanimously carried noting Mayor Pro Tempore Guarriello as Absent.

KATHERINE THULIN, WEST HOLLYWOOD, spoke in opposition of a proposed housing development on Delongpre Avenue.

SCOTT IMLER, WEST HOLLYWOOD, thanked Council for adjourning in memory of Marlene Resnek and announced her memorial service. He also addressed several questions concerning the Los Angeles Cannabis Resource Center.

ACTION: Authorize the City Manager to enter into a professional services agreement with Gardener Transportation Systems in an amount not to exceed \$261,515 to provide engineering construction plans, specifications, estimates and project management for Phase II of the La Cienega Corridor Project. **Approved as part of the Consent Calendar.**

2.M. RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING DECEMBER 1 AS "WORLD AIDS DAY": ACTION: Adopt Resolution 01-2611, "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WEST HOLLYWOOD PROCLAIMING DECEMBER 1, 2001 AS "WORLD AIDS DAY"." Approved as part of the Consent Calendar.

2.N. ESTABLISHMENT OF THE WEST HOLLYWOOD TECHNOLOGY TASK FORCE:

ACTION: Approve maintaining the Fountain Avenue peak hour restrictions: Eastbound between La Cienega Boulevard and Havenhurst Drive during 4:00 P.M. to 7:00 P.M., Monday to Friday, Eastbound and westbound between Laurel Avenue and Gardner Street at designated locations during 7:00 A.M. to 9:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M. to 7:00 P.M. Monday to Friday. Approved as part of the Consent Calendar with Councilmember Martin voting NO.

2.Q. UPDATE ON THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT STUDY SESSION:
ACTION: Receive and file the Economic Development Study Session
Executive Summary. Approved as part of the Consent Calendar.

2.R. HEDGE HEIGHT LIMITS: (ZONING TEXT AMENDMENT 01-07):

ACTION: Introduce on first reading Ordinance No. 01-615, "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WEST HOLLYWOOD ADOPTING ZONING TEXT AMENDMENT 01-07 ADOPTING THE PLANNING COMMISSION'S RECOMMENDATION TO REMOVE HEIGHT LIMITS ON HEDGES IN ALL RESIDENTIALLY ZONED AREAS IN WEST HOLLYWOOD, CALIFORNIA." Approved as part of the Consent Calendar.

THE CITY COUNCIL WILL RECESS TO THE PUBLIC FACILITIES CORPORATION: 7:10 P.M.

RECONVENE AS THE CITY COUNCIL: 7:12 P.M.

3. PUBLIC HEARINGS:

3.A. APPEAL OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION'S APPROVAL OF TEMPORARY USE PERMITS 01-11 AT 365 SAN VICENTE BOULEVARD (CEDARS SINAI LOT):

City Clerk Russell stated that the item was published in the West Hollywood Independent on November 7, 2001

John Keho, Senior Planner, provided background information as outlined in the staff report dated November 19, 2001.

Mayor Heilman opened the Public Hearing and the following speakers came forward:

RICK JACOBS, LOS ANGELES, appellant for Cedars Sinai spoke regarding the Temporary Use Permit and requested that the permit be granted for an additional year. He also provided background information about the temporary parking lot.

JEFF HABER, LOS ANGELES, appellant for Cedars Sinai spoke regarding the time limit of the Temporary Use Permit. He stated that the project as is meets and exceeds all required setbacks. He also stated that if the 15-foot setbacks are required the existing buildings would have to be demolished.

In response to Councilmember Prang, John Keho, Senior Planner, provided an overview of the application processing procedures. He stated that the concept of the landscaping had been resolved and that the improvements had not been done.

In response to Councilmember Duran, Mr. Jacobs stated that their employees are currently using the lot. He also stated that they have a series of projects but there are no plans to develop this lot.

In response to Councilmember Prang, Mr. Haber stated that the parking spaces within this lot are not tied to any parking requirements in neither Los Angeles nor West Hollywood. He also stated that this parking is in excess of what is required.

ANNETTE VAIT, WEST HOLLYWOOD, appellant for the neighborhood stated that she had sent a letter to the City Clerk requesting that this item be continued and that she is not prepared to address the issue. She expressed her concerns about Cedars Sinai being a bad neighbor and how Cedars Sinai continues to violate the conditions of the current Temporary Use Permit. She stated that an agreement was not made on the landscaping plan and that the neighbors have participated in good faith to solve this issue.

In response to Councilmember Martin, Ms. Vait stated that the 15-foot setback begins at the property line, which is the backside of the sidewalk. She also stated that the landscaping plan included trees, grass and a sprinkler system.

ANNMARIE ISLEIB, WEST HOLLYWOOD, spoke in opposition of staff's recommendations.

CHRISTOPHER LOVE, WEST HOLLYWOOD, spoke in support of the Cedars Sinai appeal.

LEON MISMAS, WEST HOLLYWOOD, spoke in support of the Cedars Sinai appeal.

LAUREN MIESTER, WEST HOLLYWOOD, spoke in support of staff's recommendations.

WILLIAM GIVERTZ, WEST HOLLYWOOD, spoke in support of the Cedars Sinai appeal.

HILLARY SELVIN, LOS ANGELES, spoke in support of Cedars Sinai appeal and asked the Council to grant a 2-year Temporary Use Permit.

DAN SIEGEL, WEST HOLLYWOOD, spoke in support of the neighborhood's appeal and requested Council to deny Cedars Sinai appeal.

CHIS ISLEIB, WEST HOLLYWOOD spoke in support of the neighborhood's appeal.

MICHAEL HIRSHFIELD, WEST HOLLYWOOD, spoke in support of the Cedars Sinai appeal.

TOM DEMILLE, WEST HOLLYWOOD, spoke in support of the neighborhood's appeal.

JEFF HABER, LOS ANGELES, appellant for Cedars Sinai responded to the neighbor's concerns regarding landscaping issues. He stated that they have met with the neighbors regarding this issue. He also stated that Cedars Sinai has never considered the rehabilitation of the buildings on the site.

ANNETTE VAIT, WEST HOLLYWOOD, stated that the conditions of the existing Temporary Use Permit are not being followed. She also spoke about vagrants living in the housing and how Cedars Sinai is not taking care of the property. She recommended that the conditions of the Temporary Use Permit be enforced.

Mayor Heilman closed the public hearing.

Councilmember Duran requested that Council grant the 15-foot setback requirements, grant an additional two or three years to the Temporary Use Permit and demolish the existing vacant buildings.

Councilmember Martin requested that the City be granted access to the thirty or forty spaces on the north portion of the lot. He also requested that Cedar's Sinai reconfigure the landscaping of the lot and add additional trees within the parking lot.

Councilmember Prang again requested that Council defer the decision of this item until Mayor Pro Tempore Guarriello returns. He addressed concerns that Cedars Sinai has not been a good neighbor and has not lived up to the conditions that have been set forth. He felt that a shorter Temporary Use Permit would be better than granting longer use for this property.

Mayor Heilman stated the City could not tell the property owner how to develop their property. He suggested that the Temporary Use Permit be granted for a longer period of time. He also expressed his support of the demolition of the existing buildings.

RECOMMENDATION: 1) Conduct a public hearing; and 2) Adopt Resolution No. 01-2613, "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF

THE CITY OF WEST HOLLYWOOD DENYING THE APPEAL OF CEDARS-SINAI MEDICAL CENTER, PARTIALLY APPROVING THE APPEAL BY ANNETTE VIAT AND APPROVING TEMPORARY USE PERMIT 01-11 FOR A ONE-YEAR TEMPORARY USE OF A PARKING LOT FOR CEDARS-SINAI MEDICAL CENTER (CSMC) EMPLOYEES AT THE PROPERTY LOCATED AT 365 SAN VICENTE BOULEVARD, WEST HOLLYWOOD, CALIFORNIA."

ACTION: Moved by Councilmember Duran and seconded by Mayor Heilman granting both appeals in partial and amending the resolution as follows: 1) A 15-foot landscape buffer on the residentially zoned property of the site along Sherbourne Drive. landscape plan to be approved by staff; 2) Grant the Temporary Use Permit for 3 years, contingent upon Cedars Sinai applying for a demolition permit within 15 days; 3) Extend scope of TUP to authorize parking on the northern portion of the Lot upon demolition of the residential structures, subject to construction of landscape buffer: 4) Delete Section 4.14 the requirement for the bi-monthly meetings: 5) In Section 1.4 of the resolution strike-out 12 months and replace with 36 months and strike the second sentence; 6) Section 2.3 of the resolution should be stricken; 7) Amend Section 3.1 to include trees (which may be potted or planted) in interior of the parking lot in accordance to the landscape plan; 8) Create a subcommittee of the neighborhood to include Marty Strudler, President of West Hollywood West and Lauren Miester to review the landscape design along with staff; 9) Construction commence within 45 days of the issuance of necessary permits received with the objective of completing the construction within a period of 6 months thereafter subject only to delays due to conditions or circumstances beyond the applicant's control; 10) Amend the title of the resolution to reflect that the Council partially approved and partially denied the Cedars appeal and partially approved and partially denied the appeal of Annette Vait; 12) Adopt all seven pages of conditions as above amended.

City Clerk Russell stated that the item was published in the West Hollywood Independent on November 7, 2001.

Jack McGee, Contract Planner, provided background information as outlined in the staff report dated November 19, 2001.

Mayor Heilman opened the Public Hearing and the following speakers came forward:

TOM DEMILLE, WEST HOLLYWOOD, spoke in support of the staff recommendations to deny the Zoning Text Amendment.

TODD ELLIOT, WEST HOLLYWOOD, spoke about the standards of the Conditional Use Permits and spoke in opposition to staff's recommendations.

HILLARY SELVIN, LOS ANGELES, spoke in opposition to staff's recommendations.

Mayor Heilman closed the public hearing.

RECOMMENDATION: Deny the Zoning Text Amendment, and retain the existing requirement for a Conditional use Permit for each Tall Wall Sign.

ACTION: Moved by Councilmember Prang and seconded by Councilmember Duran to approve staff's recommendations. Unanimously carried noting Mayor Pro Tempore as Absent.

3.C. HEDGE HEIGHT LIMITS: (ZONING TEXT AMENDMENT 01-07) ACTION: Moved to Consent Calendar as Item 2.R.

Mildred Ramos Majoros, Development Specialist, provided background information as outlined in the staff report dated November 19, 2001.

RECOMMENDATION: 1) Make one direct appointment – Mayor Heilman; and 2) Confirm pending appointment of Mary Sweeny – Councilmember Duran.

ACTION: Mayor Heilman appointed Kim Schnider.

Councilmember Duran confirmed Mary Sweeny as his appointment.

4.B. UPDATE ON THE CITY OF WEST HOLLYWOOD "VISION 2020" STRATEGIC PLANNING PROCESS:

Mildred Ramos Majoros, Development Specialist, provided background information as outlined in the staff report dated November 19, 2001.

ACTION: Moved by Councilmember Prang and seconded by Councilmember Duran to approve staff's recommendation and directed the City Clerk to post the Code of Conduct on the City's Web site. Unanimously carried noting Mayor Pro Tempore Guarriello as Absent.
